Dear Customer:

We are continuing to experience dramatic increases in the cost of propylene monomer due to the enormous volatility in the fuels and petrochemical industries. In addition, our costs for other raw materials, working capital and operating labor have significantly escalated. Therefore, Basell USA Inc., Basell Canada Inc., Basell Poliolefinas, S. de R.L. de C.V., Basell Mexico, S. de R.L. de C.V. and Equistar Chemicals, L.P., members of the LyondellBasell Industries group of companies, will implement a price increase in the amount of USD \$0.15 per pound on all grades of our polypropylene products sold in North America, effective with shipments on and after July 1, 2008.

In addition, our costs for utilities and transportation have also experienced enormous inflation over the past several months in the form of price increases and surcharges. These high prices have created an environment where without relief, it will be commercially impracticable for Basell and Equistar to economically operate our plants or arrange for the transportation of our resins.

Therefore, please be advised that also effective on July 1, 2008, Basell and Equistar will implement a USD \$0.02 per pound surcharge on all of our polypropylene products sold in North America. This surcharge, which is necessary to ensure that production and transportation of our polypropylene remains economically feasible, is separate from and in addition to Basell's and Equistar's previously announced price increases and the price increase identified above, and includes both shipments (railcar, bulk truck and carton) and railcar taps. It applies to all current and future orders, without delay and without price protection.

This tremendous volatility and uncertainty is likely to continue for the foreseeable future. As a result, this surcharge may or may not insure the continued production at our plants or transportation of our finished products. We will periodically review the effect the surcharge is having on our production and transportation costs and we will be prepared to adjust it as needed.

As always, acceptance of orders is subject to Basell's and Equistar's ability to supply and Basell and Equistar reserve the right to accept or reject orders.

We appreciate your understanding and your continued business during this difficult time. Your account manager will contact you to discuss this matter further.

The rapidly escalating energy market is creating extreme uncertainty in the July forecast for polymer grade propylene ("PGP") monomer. July PGP monomer price nominations are ranging from \$0.09/lb up to \$0.15/lb. In addition to unprecedented increases in the cost of propylene, the costs of manufacturing and delivering polypropylene have escalated over the past few months creating the need for an increase beyond the cost rise of PGP monomer. Consequently, please be advised that effective July 1, 2008 TOTAL PETROCHEMICALS USA, INC. ("TPI") will increase the transaction price for all grades of polypropylene by the increase in the final settled PGP monomer price from June 2008 to July 2008 as published by Chemical Market Associates, Inc. (CMAI), plus five cents per pound (\$0.05/lb).

To control costs and optimize the supply chain, it is critical that you provide an accurate forecast of your July polypropylene demand. As always, acceptance of orders is subject to TPI's ability to supply. TPI will make reasonable efforts to ship confirmed July orders prior to July 31st, 2008, but in no event will July orders be rolled to August at July pricing. Your TPI sales representative is available to answer questions you may have regarding this price increase notification. We understand the difficulties this volatile market creates and appreciate the business you have entrusted to us.

As I have indicated to you previously, the cost of raw materials to manufacture amino molding compounds has risen sharply over the last 24 months. In the last 6 months alone, there has been a 35% increase in the price of melamine crystal and urea prill has increased 70%. I have been given many reasons for the increases; the two major factors are a global shortage of material and the low value of the dollar. I am also being informed that further increases are possible. Companies are calling for "Force Majeure" in pricing agreements.

While everyone at Raytor Compounds has worked diligently to control costs, the increase in raw material has far outweighed our cost control abilities. In order for Raytor Compounds Inc. to remain a viable and operating business, I must raise the price of our compound across the board.

Effective Monday June 24, 2008, the price of all Raytor Amino Molding Compounds will increase by 17¢ a pound.

Effective July 1, 2008, Eastman Chemical Company is implementing a price increase of **\$0.05/lb** on all Clear EASTMAN™ PET, EASTMAN AQUA™ PET, ParaStar™ PET, HEATWAVE® Polymer, VERSATRAY™ Plastics and EASTMAN™ PET 5214A formulations for the NAFTA region.

When we announced a range of \$0.03-\$0.05/lb increase in our May 30 letter, we hoped to hold the increase to \$0.03/lb; however recent events do not allow us that option. While holding to the originally announced range, this increase will not fully cover raw material increases, therefore; we are announcing another \$0.04/lb increase effective July 15, 2008.

Asia Contract Price for Paraxylene (PX) has been nominated at \$1750 to \$1770/mt, up from \$1440/mt, while Asia Spot Price for PX has been trading above \$1700/mt. As a key raw material in the production of Terephthalic Acid, used in PET, this has an immediate and dramatic impact on the costs of the entire PET supply chain where inventories have been held very low due to these higher raw material costs. The cost of the other key raw material, Ethylene Glycol, is also now increasing.

In addition to increasing raw material costs, fuel surcharges for all transportation modes continue to escalate, now reaching unprecedented levels that dramatically increase the cost of delivery.

During the past few weeks and months, we've seen unprecedented increases in the price of crude oil and derivatives. Natural gas, propane, paraxylene, and many other raw materials have escalated dramatically. In addition, we are seeing substantially increased costs for both the manufacture and transportation of our products. These costs are impacted by the cost of energy as well as shortages of equipment and drivers. We're currently experiencing surcharges for truck and rail deliveries of product that are in excess of thirty percent of our planned costs.

As a result of these factors, you are seeing and are likely to continue to see increases in price for Eastman products and services in the weeks and months ahead. While we regret the need to increase price for these reasons, we are not able to absorb these extraordinary increases and sustain our viability as a reliable supplier.
